Pupil Premium received

£ 71,475

Pupil Premium funding supports pupil in the following ways:-

- To provide intervention programmes for underachieving pupils and those with SEN (Special Educational Needs).
- To employ an additional member of staff to provide targeted support to identified children to help them achieve expected progress.
- To provide one-to-one tuition for some pupils, including Pixl and booster session.
- To subsidise educational visits. For some children this has a huge impact on their self-esteem and confidence.
- To provide a holistic approach to the education for our most vulnerable children by providing support from our Children and Families Officer, access to the school breakfast club and equipment and uniform where necessary.
